CARPLS attorneys give free legal advice and other help to homeowners in Cook County facing mortgage foreclosure. If a pro bono or legal aid attorney might be able to take your case, CARPLS attorneys will tell you where to call.

- CARPLS helps low- and middle-income people.
- The CARPLS Hotline is very busy, but wait times will not exceed 20 minutes. Follow the instructions, and if you are asked to leave a message, someone will call you back.
- For \$25, you can avoid waiting and set a time for an attorney to call you. You need a credit card and access to the internet. Visit www.carpls.org to make the appointment.
