**RE:** Courtesy Notice: Updated Illinois Smoke Alarm Law

## **SUMMARY:**

The Illinois Smoke Detector Act of 1988 requires all dwellings in the State of Illinois to have smoke alarms. An <u>amendment (PA100-200)</u> has been made to this act that will take effect **January 1**, **2023.** This amendment requires all smoke alarms with removable batteries to be replaced with 10-year sealed battery smoke alarms. The new smoke alarms must also have a 15-minute silence button to prevent deactivation of the alarm while cooking.

This law applies to every dwelling unit, single family residence, and mixed-use structures that contain at least one dwelling unit. This change does not affect units with hardwired or low-frequency wireless smoke alarms. Fines for non-compliance start at \$100 and can rise as high as \$1500.
