




As part of IHDA's project application process, applicants are required to provide proof that projects are within an acceptable distance from fresh, healthy food.

- Projects in Chicago, Metro Chicago or Other Metro areas must be within at least
 1 mile of a full-service grocery store, farmers' or produce market.
- Non-metro area projects must be within 5 miles of a grocery store or market.
- Applicants can provide proof of acceptable food access using the Food Access tool on IHDA's webpage at https://www.ihda.org/developers/market-research/food-access-ppa-verification-process/






 The Food Access tool can by found by hovering over **Developers** in the main menu and clicking on **Market Research**.







From the options on the page, click on **Food Access PPA Verification Process** link




You will be directed to a page containing information about the Food Access tool.






Click on the map image for the Food Access tool.







Once the Food Access Locator has opened, you will see a map on the right-hand side of the screen with search and map options on the left.

You can select the location of your project and find food access points near it in a couple ways:

- You can zoom in on the map to its location and click the project site
- Or enter your project location address in the search bar in the top of the left-hand side of the map.

Once you have selected your project location, the tool will automatically draw a circle with the predetermined radius around the point and select all food access points within the circle.
